BACKGROUND: At the September 18, 2018 meeting Council adopted Resolution #18-60 which set the preliminary levy for the City of Waseca at \$4,540,905. The General Fund budget includes a 5.5% increase in the tax levy amount requested. The final levy cannot be higher than the preliminary levy, but it can be lower.

At the budget work sessions the Council has reviewed the individual department budgets, the Capital Improvement Plan, Equipment Replacement Plan and discussed funding scenarios for the City's 5-Year Infrastructure Improvement Plan. Included within the 2019 budgets are continued steps toward meeting the funding requirements for the City's capital needs – both above and below the ground. The proposed changes will allow the City to continue to implement sewer lining, storm water management, water main replacement and street reconstruction projects.

Additionally, during budget work sessions Council directed staff to bring forward utility rate tables with adjustments to meet the revenue requirements. The attached resolutions include the updated rate tables to meet these requirements.

SUMMARY OF GENERAL FUND BUDGET INFORMATION:

The 2019 General Fund budget includes the following:

- Funding for Capital Improvement for streets, storm water, parks, and city facilities improvements.
- Funding to begin to address infrastructure deficiencies resulting in inflow and infiltration problems.
- Funding for Equipment Replacement Plan.
- Funding for salary adjustments from the Classification and Compensation Study findings. Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for employees effective January 1, 2019.
- Funding for projected health, workers compensation and liability insurance increases.
- Minor adjustments for department needs and minimal Increases for Contractual Services.
- Allocation for Safe Haven Fund Match.

BACKGROUND: The City Council has set a public hearing to take comment on a proposal to raise the age at which tobacco products may be purchased to 21.

BUDGET IMPACT: None.

POLICY QUESTION: Does the City wish to raise the legal age at which tobacco products (referred to as licensed products in the ordinance) may be purchased?

Regardless of the Council's answer to this question, there are a number of actions that might be taken by the Council to improve the current ordinance without raising the purchase age. The City Attorney has submitted a number of proposed changes using language originally proposed by the American Lung Association. There are a large number of moving parts in the ordinance. To help the Council deal with this, the City Attorney is proposing that the Council make amendments to the base ordinance. There are seven basic amendments to the ordinance, some of which impact language in multiple places. The amendments are as follows:

- A. Include "Aerosal" in the definition to broaden the cost of electronic delivery devices that are regulated.
- B. Define "Licensed Products" to group all regulated products under one definition for ease of use in the ordinance.
- C. Indicates the license restrictions are grounds for denying issuance or renewal of a license.
- D. Change the legal age to buy tobacco products from 18 to 21.
- E. Lists requirements for a license holder when verifying the age of someone purchasing tobacco.
- F. Requires license holders to post notice of legal sales age and verification requirements.

G. Removes the penalty for a person under the age of 18 who is in possession of tobacco or tobacco related products. – See footnote 2 for an explanation by ALA as to why they wish to remove this penalty.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED: No change to current ordinance.

RECOMMENDATION: Council may table the ordinance or may take action to approve some, all, or none of the proposed amendments. Staff suggests that the Council handle the seven basic amendments individually and then approve the entire document. Council may also elect to attempt to handle all amendment in one motion.

ORDINANCE NO. 1069

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE LICENSING, SALE AND POSSESSION OF TOBACCO AND TOBACCO-RELATED PRODUCTS AND DEVICES WITHIN THE CITY OF WASECA, MINNESOTA.

The City of Waseca does ordain:

Section 1. Waseca Code Chapter 111 is hereby amended as follows (deleted material is erossed out; new material is underlined; sections and subsections not being amended are omitted)¹:

§111.01 DEFINITIONS.

* * * *

ELECTRONIC DELIVERY DEVICES. Any product containing or delivering nicotine, lobelia, or any other substance intended for human consumption that can be used by a person in the delivery of nicotine or any other substance through inhalation of [(A) aerosol or] vapor from the product. ELECTRONIC DELIVERY DEVICE includes any component part of such a product whether or not sold separately. ELECTRONIC DELIVERY DEVICE shall not include any product that has been approved or otherwise certified by the United States Food and Drug Administration for legal sales for use in tobacco cessation treatment or other medical purposes, and is being marketed and sold solely for that approved purpose.

[(B) LICENSED PRODUCTS. The term that collectively refers to any tobacco, tobacco-related device, tobacco related product, electronic delivery device, or nicotine or lobelia delivery product.]

NICOTINE OR LOBELIA DELIVERY PRODUCT. Any product containing or delivering nicotine or lobelia intended for human consumption, or any part of such a product, that is not tobacco or an electronic delivery device as defined in this section.

Nicotine or lobelia delivery product does not include any product that has been approved or otherwise certified for legal sale by the united states food and drug administration for tobacco use cessation or for other medical purposes, and is being marketed and sold solely for that approved purpose.

¹ Amendments proposed by the American Lung Association (ALA) have been placed in [brackets] and *italicized*. Legal counsel for the City (Flaherty & Hood, P.A.) has reviewed these proposed amendments and determined they are each within the City's legal authority to enact, should the City Council wish to do so. The City Council is free to enact, some, none or all of the ALA-proposed amendments. Each ALA-proposed amendment is given a **bold capital letter** (A – G) before the proposed amendment to allow for the city to choose which ALA-proposed amendments it would like to accept or deny. Where a proposed amendment affects multiple portions of the ordinance, all affected provisions are identified with the same corresponding bold capital letter. The bold capital letters are intended to allow the City Council to easily accept or deny multiple proposed amendments without needing to re-draft the ordinance prior to its introduction. The brackets, italicized text, and capital bold letters will be removed from the final ordinance prior to its formal adoption. Changes shown in standard legislative text and not bracketed and italicized are changes the City's legal counsel agrees are needed to improve the internal consistency and enforceability of the City's ordinance.

SMOKING. Inhaling or exhaling smoke from any lighted or heated cigarette, cigar, pipe, or any other lighted or heated tobacco or plant product, or inhaling or exhaling vapor from an e-cigarette or any electronic delivery device. Smoking shall include carrying a lighted or heated cigarette, cigar, or pipe or any) other lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation or carrying an electronic delivery device that is turned on or otherwise activated.

TOBACCO. Any product containing, made, or derived from tobacco that is intended for human consumption, whether chewed, smoked, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, or any component, part, or accessory of a tobacco product including but not limited to cigars; cheroots; stogies; perique; granulated, plug cut, crimp cut, ready rubbed, and other smoking tobacco; snuff; snuff flour; cavendish; plug and twist tobacco; fine cut and other chewing tobaccos; shorts; refuse scraps, clippings, cuttings and sweepings of tobacco; and other kinds and forms of tobacco. Tobacco excludes any tobacco product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco-cessation product, as a tobacco-dependence product, or for other medical purposes, and is being marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.

TOBACCO-RELATED DEVICE. Cigarette papers or pipes for smoking or other devices intentionally designed or intended to be used in a manner which enables the chewing, sniffing, smoking, or inhalation of vapors of tobacco or tobacco products.

Tobacco-related devices include components of tobacco-related devices which may be marketed or sold separately.

§ 111.02 LICENSE REQUIRED.

No person shall directly or indirectly or by means of any device keep for retail sale, sell at retail or otherwise dispense for profit or gain any [(B) licensed products tobacco related product or e-cigarettes] at any place in the city unless a license therefore shall first have been obtained as provided in this chapter.

§ 111.03 LICENSE RESTRICTIONS.

- [(C) Grounds for denying the issuance or renewal of a license include but are not limited to the following:]
- (A) No license shall be issued to an applicant for sale of [(B) licensed products tobacco or e-cigarettes] at any place other than his or her establishment or place of business.
- (B) No license shall be issued for the sale of [(B) licensed products tobacco or eeigarettes] at a moveable place of business; nor shall any license be issued for the sale of
 [(B) licensed products tobacco] at more than one place of business.
- (C) No person shall sell or give away any $[\underline{(B) \ licensed \ products} \ tobacco, tobacco paper, tobacco wrapper or tobacco related product or e-cigarettes] to any person below the age of <math>[\underline{(D) \ 2118}]$ years.

- (D) All sales must be made in such a manner that requires the vendee to specifically ask a clerk for the [(B) licensed products tobacco related product]. It is unlawful for any person to offer for sale any [(B) licensed products tobacco related product or e-cigarettes] by means of self-service merchandising, including vending machines. All sales must be handled with the intervention of a clerk. All other sales are unlawful.
- (E) Any person selling any [(B) licensed products tobacco related products or e-cigarettes] must require picture identification, such as a driver's license, passport or other legal identification card as recognized by the state, to prove the age of any customer who reasonably appears to be under the legal age.

§ 111.06 LICENSE QUESTIONNAIRE.

The applicant will also provide questionnaires pertaining to age of sale laws to all clerks who will be selling [(B) *licensed products* tobacco or e-eigarettes] and keep them on file.

§ 111.08 COMPLIANCE CHECKS.

The license holder will be subjected to at least two compliance checks per year. Law enforcement personnel or a person designated by law enforcement officials will conduct random, unannounced inspections at each location where [(B) licensed products tobacco or e-cigarettes products] are sold to test compliance with age-of-sale laws. These inspections shall include, but not be limited to surveillance including minors under the age of 18 who attempt to purchase [(B) licensed products tobacco or e-cigarettes products]. A finding of non-compliance during the unannounced inspection shall constitute a violation of this chapter. Additional compliance checks during the license year shall be required following a violation by any licensed retail tobacco or e-cigarettes outlet.

§ 111.10 VIOLATIONS.

- (F) A license holder must have all self-service [(B) licensed products tobacco or e-eigarettes products] relocated behind the service counter or locked doors by January 1,1996. Non-compliance will result in license suspension until the [(B) licensed products tobacco or e-eigarettes] have been placed behind a counter or locked doors.
- (G) Any correspondence concerning compliance with the city ordinance will be sent to the <u>licensee's vendor's</u> place of business by registered mail. The licensee shall be sent a written notice at least ten days in advance informing the licensee of the specific ordinance

or statutory violation upon which any suspension or revocation would be based and the licensee has the right to be represented by counsel and present evidence on its behalf.

§ 111.12 SALE OR FURNISHING TOBACCO OR TOBACCO RELATED PRODUCTS.

(A) For the purpose of this section, the following definition shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

TOBACCO RELATED PRODUCT. Cigarettes, eigars, cheroots, stogies, perique, granulated, plug out, crimp cut, ready, rubbed or other smoking tobacco, snuff, snuff flower, cavendish, plug and twist tobacco, fine cut and other chewing tobaccos, shorts, refuse scrips, clippings, cuttings and sweepings of tobacco prepared in such manner as to be suitable for chewing, sniffing or smoking in a pipe, rolling paper or other tobacco related devices.

(\underline{BA}) No person shall sell or give away any [$\underline{(B)}$ licensed products tobacco or tobacco related product, as defined in division (A) above] to any person below the age of [$\underline{(D)}$ 2118] years.

[(E)(1) Age Verification. Licensees must verify by means of government-issued photographic identification that the purchaser is at least 21 years of age.

Verification is not required for a person over the age of 30. That the person appeared to be 30 years of age or older does not constitute a defense to a violation of this subsection.]

[(F)(2) Signage. Notice of the legal sales age and age verification requirement must be posted at each location where licensed products are offered for sale. The required signage, which will be provided to the licensee by the city, must be posted in a manner that is clearly visible to anyone who is or is considering making a purchase.]

- (CB) Whoever sells or gives away any [(B) licensed products tobacco or tobacco related product] to any person [(D) who is at least 18 years of age, but] below the age of [(D) $\underline{2118}$] years is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
- (C) Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 609.685, subdivision 1a, whoever sells or gives away any licensed products to any person below the age of 18 years is guilty of a misdemeanor. Whoever violates this subsection a subsequent time within five years of a previous conviction under this subsection is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- $-[\underline{(G)}(D)]$ It shall be a petty misdemeanor for any person under the age of 18 years to possess tobacco or tobacco related products.]²

I removed PUP language here. At its core, a licensing ordinance regulates the behavior of the licensees. Penalizing underage persons detracts from the focus of the licensing code and refocuses enforcement resources from the

licensees to oftentimes addicted young consumers. A <u>2017 Minnesota Annual Synar Report</u> on youth access enforcement revealed that underage persons were cited 3.6 times and assessed a fine 2.6 times more often than retailers. Even if PUP is not penalized in the local tobacco retailer licensing code, retailers maintain the authority to ask underage persons to leave the premises if they attempt to purchase products.

There is no evidence to support an assertion that PUP penalties are effective at reducing youth smoking significantly and, historically, these laws were lobbied for by the commercial tobacco industry to punish youth users while the industry simultaneously targeted, and continues to target, youth to replace a dying consumer base and maintain profits in a dwindling market.

Furthermore, many advocates are concerned that PUP penalties open the door to selective enforcement against youth from certain racial, ethnic, and SES groups. Evidence suggests that youth of color in Minnesota are disproportionately over-represented in similar status-level offenses, increasing their interactions with law enforcement and resulting in their introduction to the criminal justice system. Finally, Minnesota law currently penalizes PUP and false ID prohibitions and no further enforcement is needed at the local level.

ELECTRONIC DELIVERY DEVICE shall not include any product that has been approved or otherwise certified by the United States Food and Drug Administration for legal sales for use in tobacco cessation treatment or other medical purposes, and is being marketed and sold solely for that approved purpose.

Comment [PHLC1]: Waseca's ordinance was quite short. The additions/revisions I've made would help to flesh out and strengthen the ordinance, modernize it, put it in compliance with state law and federal law, and align it with best public health practices (in addition to adopting a T21 policy). This helps to ensure the law has strong enforcement mechanisms and clearly and unambiguously sets out the requirements of the law. This will be particularly important if the City moves forward with T21. We have revised the text of the ordinance through track changes and provided additional feedback through comments.

Comment [PHLC2]: A strong definitions section helps make all terms used throughout the ordinance clear and unambiguous. This reduces the likelihood of successful litigation if any portion of the ordinance were challenged. I've added some critical terms that were missing.

Comment [PHLC3]: Right now, the code does not refer to all products that require licensure under state law. I do not believe this was intentional. However, all products do need to be listed consistently throughout the ordinance for the regulations to apply to them. For ease, many jurisdictions are adopting an "umbrella term" for all state-mandated licensed products (tobacco, tobacco-related device, electronic delivery device, and nicotine or lobelia delivery product) and refer to that throughout the ordinance. I did that here. If the city does not want to use this umbrella term, they'll want to remove this definition and change the term "licensed products" throughout this ordinance and replace it with a list like: tobacco, tobacco-related device, electronic delivery device, or nicotine or lobelia delivery product.

The notice shall set forth the nature, date and time of violation, the name of the official issuing the notice.
- (B) Once the notice is given, the alleged violator may, within seven days of the time of issuance of the notice, request a hearing in writing, as is provided for hereafter. Failure to request a hearing in writing within

Comment [PHLC7]: This language is fine, just a note for compliance checks. State law requires municipal licensing authorities to conduct at least one compliance check each year. This state-mandated compliance check "must involve minors over the age of 15, but under the age of 18." So, municipalities would be violating state law if they only did their compliance checks with 18- to 20-year-olds.

The state tobacco licensing law allows local governments to go further than state licensing law (e.g., implement and enforce a T21 policy). This means that municipalities with T21 laws can conduct compliance checks to both satisfy state law (MLSA of 18) and enforce the local T21 law. To do so, municipalities could either conduct one compliance check with a person between the ages of 15 and 17 (to satisfy the state compliance check requirement) and a person between the ages of 18 and 20 (to enforce local T21), or conduct more than one compliance check—one with a person between the ages of 15 and 17 and another with a person between the ages of 18 and 20.

§ 111.12 SALE OR FURNISHING TOBACCO OR TOBACCO RELATED PRODUCTS.

- (BD) No person shall sell or give away any tobacco or tobacco related product, as defined in division (A) abovelicensed product to any person below the age of 18-21 years.
 - (1) Age verification. Licensees must verify by means of government-issued photographic identification that the purchaser is at least 21 years of age. Verification is not required for a person over the age of 30. That the person appeared to be 30 years of age or older does not constitute a defense to a violation of this subsection.
 - (2) Signage. Notice of the legal sales age and age verification requirement must be posted at each location where licensed products are offered for sale. The required signage, which will be provided to the licensee by the city, must be posted in a manner that is clearly visible to anyone who is or is considering making a purchase.
- (CE) Whoever-Any person over the age of 21 that sells or gives away any tobacco or tobacco-related licensed product to any person below the age of 18-21 years is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.

 (D) It shall be a petty misdemeanor for any person under the age of 18 years to possess tobacco or tobacco related products; (86 Code, § 4.34) (Am. Ord. 669, passed 10-17-95; Am. Ord. 1018, passed 3-18-14)

Comment [PHLC8]: I removed PUP language here. At its core, a licensing ordinance regulates the behavior of the licensees. Penalizing underage persons detracts from the focus of the licensing code and refocuses enforcement resources from the licensees to oftentimes addicted young consumers. A 2017 Minnesota Annual Synar Report on youth access enforcement revealed that underage persons were cited 3.6 times and assessed a fine 2.6 times more often than retailers. Even if PUP is not penalized in the local tobacco retailer licensing code, retailers maintain the authority to ask underage persons to leave the premises if they attempt to purchase products.

There is no evidence to support an assertion that PUP penalties are effective at reducing youth smoking significantly and, historically, these laws were lobbied for by the commercial tobacco industry to punish youth users while the industry simultaneously targeted, and continues to target, youth to replace a dying consumer base and maintain profits in a dwindling market.

Furthermore, many advocates are concerned that PUP penalties open the door to selective enforcement against youth from certain racial, ethnic, and SES groups. Evidence suggests that youth of color in Minnesota are disproportionately over-represented in similar status-level offenses, increasing their interactions with law enforcement and resulting in their introduction to the criminal justice system. Finally, Minnesota law currently penalizes PUP and false ID prohibitions and no further enforcement is needed at the local level.

WHEREAS, tobacco use is the foremost preventable cause of premature death in the United States, tesponsible for approximately 480,000 deaths a year and 20.8 million premature deaths in the U.S. over the past 50 years since the first Surgeon General's report on smoking in 1964;

WHEREAS, in Minnesota, tobacco use claims 5,900 lives each year and is responsible for more than \$3.19 billion annually in health care costs;

WHEREAS, the annual economic impact of smoking in the U.S. is more than \$300 billion in health care and lost worker productivity costs; ⁵

WHEREAS, national data show that about 95 percent of adult smokers begin smoking before they turn 21, and that the ages of 18 to 21 are a critical period when many smokers move from experimental smoking to regular, daily use;

WHEREAS, the developing brains of young people are particularly susceptible to the addictive properties of nicotine, and as a result, approximately 3 out of 4 teen smokers end up smoking into adulthood;

WHEREAS, electronic smoking device use among minors has recently tripled;¹⁰

WHEREAS, a 2015 Institute of Medicine report concludes that raising the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products nationwide will reduce tobacco initiation, particularly among adolescents aged 15 to 17, and that it will improve health across the lifespan and save lives; and that raising the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products to 21 nationwide would, over time, lead to a 12 percent decrease in smoking prevalence;

WHEREAS, the Institute of Medicine also predicts that raising the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products to 21 nationwide would result in 223,000 fewer premature deaths, 50,000 fewer deaths from lung cancer, and 4.2 million fewer years of life lost for those born between 2000 and 2019, and that it would result in near immediate reductions in preterm birth, low birth weight, and sudden infant death syndrome;

WHEREAS, a growing number of communities have enacted laws mandating a minimum legal sales age (MLSA) for tobacco products to 21, including the states of Hawaii and California;

WHEREAS, three-quarters of U.S. adults favor raising the MLSA for tobacco products to 21, including seven in ten smokers;

WHEREAS, the retail impact of ordinances mandating a minimum legal sales age of 21 for tobacco products is expected to be minimal in the first years of the policy because it works by reducing or delaying initiation of smoking, especially among younger populations;

WHEREAS, raising the legal drinking age to 21 led to reduced alcohol use and dependence among youth, and contributed to a decline in drunk driving fatalities;

WHEREAS, according to the Minnesota Student Survey, 26% Waseca 11th grade males and 13% of Waseca 9th grade males have used tobacco, including e-cigarettes and hookah, in the past 30 days.

Waseca School Board urges the City of Waseca to change the minimum legal sales age of 21 to purchase tobacco products.

A RESOLUTION OF CITY OF WASECA, MINNESOTA APPROVING A RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waseca ("City Council") has approve a Tax Abatement Housing Program to encourage housing development within the City and has asked Waseca County to approve a tax abatement to augment the City program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Waseca desires to encourage, promote and facilitate residential development on vacant residential lots located within the City of Waseca ("City"), and has adopted a Residential Tax Abatement, a true and correct copy is on file at the offices of the City Manager, pursuant to which the City intends to offer abatement of City-imposed property taxes on qualifying residential properties in the City for which building permits for single family residential structures are applied for and issued by the City on or before December 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the parcels of real property for which abatements of City of Waseca-imposed property taxes are conditionally approved herein are identified and legally described in Resolution 17-40, Appendix A (the "eligible parcels"), and generally consist of every current vacant, unimproved parcel of property in a residential zoning district in the City of Waseca that are served by municipal infrastructure including central water and sanitary sewer service; and

WHEREAS, the City will use tax abatement for the purposes provided for in the Abatement Law and the City's approved Tax Abatement to match the proposed term of the abatements for each eligible property that satisfies the conditions for abatement established herein ("the qualifying parcels described in Resolution 17-40, Appendix A"); and

WHEREAS, the City proposes to use tax abatement for the purposes provided for in the Abatement Law and the Abatement Policy (and hereinafter defined). The proposed term of the abatements for each eligible property that satisfies the conditions for abatement established herein ("the qualifying parcels") will be for a term not to exceed ten years, with the City abating 50 percent of the portion of the City's share of ad valorem property taxes on the qualifying parcel derived from the value of the residential structure for which the City issues a building permit and paid by the property owner. The total abatement amount for any single qualifying parcel is not to exceed \$20,458.85, for a maximum total abatement of all eligible parcels' City-imposed property taxes not to exceed \$2,045.85. The abatements will apply to the City's share of ad valorem property taxes on the qualifying parcels derived from the value of the residential structure for which the City issues a building permit and paid by the record owners of such qualifying parcels (the "abatements"); and

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2016, the Council held a public hearing on the question of the abatements, with proper notice being duly given and published in advance; and

WHEREAS, the Abatements are authorized under Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.1812 through 469.1815 (the "Abatement Law").

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waseca ("City Council") desires to encourage, promote and facilitate residential development on vacant residential lots located throughout the City of Waseca ("City"), and has adopted a Residential Tax Abatement Policy (the "Abatement Policy"), a true and correct copy of which is attached hereto as Appendix A, pursuant to which the City intends to offer abatement of City-imposed property taxes on qualifying residential properties in the City for which building permits for single family residential structures are applied for and issued by the City on or before December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the parcels of real property for which abatements of City-imposed property taxes are conditionally approved herein are identified and legally described on Appendix A attached hereto (the "eligible parcels"), and generally consist of every currently vacant, unimproved parcel of property in a residential zoning district in the City that is served by municipal infrastructure including central water and sanitary sewer service; and

WHEREAS, the City proposes to use tax abatement for the purposes provided for in the Abatement Law and the Abatement Policy (and hereinafter defined). The proposed term of the abatements for each eligible property that satisfies the conditions for abatement established herein ("the qualifying parcels") will be for a term not to exceed ten years, in a total abatement amount for any single qualifying parcel not to exceed \$20,458.85, for a maximum total abatement of all eligible parcels' City-imposed property taxes not to exceed \$2,045,885. The abatements will apply to the City's share of ad valorem property taxes on the qualifying parcels derived from the value of the residential structure for which the City issues a building permit and paid by the record owners of such qualifying parcels (the "abatements"); and

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2016 the Council held a public hearing on the question of the abatements, with proper notice being duly given and published in advance.

WHEREAS, the Abatements are authorized under Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.1812 through 469.1815 (the "Abatement Law").

WHEREAS, the City would like to add parcel identification number 17.703.0020 to the Appendix A.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Waseca that:

- 1. Findings for the Abatement. The City Council hereby makes the following findings:
 - a. The Council expects the benefits to the City of the abatements to at least equal or exceed the costs to the City thereof.
 - b. Granting the abatements is in the public interest because it will increase or preserve the tax base of the City, provide employment opportunities in the City, and increase the housing opportunities available in the City.
 - c. None of the eligible parcels are located in a tax increment financing district.

- d. In any year, the total amount of property taxes conditionally approved for abatement by the City by this and other resolutions, if any, does not exceed the greater of ten percent (10%) of the City's current net tax capacity or \$200,000.
- 2. <u>Terms of Abatements.</u> The abatements are hereby approved for eligible parcels subject to the conditions precedent set forth in Paragraph 3. The terms of the abatements are as follows:
 - a. The abatements shall apply to the taxes payable in the years 2019 through 2030 inclusive, and at the option of the applicant property owner, be for one of the following terms and abatement amounts:
 - i. three (3) years, with the City abating 100 percent of the portion of the City's share of ad valorem property taxes on the qualifying parcel derived from the value of the residential structure for which the City issues a building permit and paid by the property owner;
 - ii. six (6) years, with the City abating 75 percent of the portion of the City's share of ad valorem property taxes on the qualifying parcel derived from the value of the residential structure for which the City issues a building permit and paid by the property owner; or
 - iii. ten (10) years, with the City abating 50 percent of the portion of the City's share of ad valorem property taxes on the qualifying parcel derived from the value of the residential structure for which the City issues a building permit and paid by the property owner.
- 3. <u>Conditions of Abatements.</u> The abatements for any eligible parcel are contingent upon the satisfaction of the following conditions:
 - a. The owner of such parcel shall apply for and be issued a building permit for the new construction of a single family or multi-family residential structure (including stick built on site construction, modular construction, and manufactured homes) on such parcel, on or before December 31, 2020;
 - b. The owner of such parcel shall demonstrate that the assessed market value of the parcel for which a building permit is issued under Paragraph 3.a herein shall not exceed \$500,000.00 upon the completion of the construction of such single family or multi-family residential structure.
 - c. The owner of such parcel shall complete an application for abatement together with the building permit application required in Paragraph 3.a that includes:
 - i. a pre-construction value estimate for the eligible parcel; and

- ii. additional information as may be requested by City staff or the City Council as necessary to evaluate the project and its potential impact on and benefit to the City.
- d. The owner of such parcel shall enter into an abatement agreement consistent with the terms of this Resolution in a form satisfactory to the City;
- e. The owner of such parcel and any contractors, subcontractors, materials suppliers or other agents involved in the construction of the residential structure shall at all times comply with applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations; and
- f. Waseca County (the "County") and the Waseca School District (the "School District"), if they so choose, shall each approve an abatement program for the eligible parcels upon the same terms as set forth herein for the County's and School District's share of the property tax amount which the County receives from the qualifying parcels.
- 4. The abatements shall be subject to all the terms and limitations of the Abatement Law, as well as the Tax Abatement Agreements between the property owners and the City required by paragraph 3.b setting forth the rights and obligations of the parties with respect to the abatements in greater detail.
- 5. The abatements may not be modified or changed during the terms thereof.

This Resolution shall become effective immediately after its adoption.

How does this item pertain to Vision 2030 goals?	Continue updating aging infrastructure to protect existing development and encourage future development: Focused flow monitoring of the sanitary sewer system is a specific action program to assist the City in locating I&I sources.		

BACKGROUND: The City of Waseca has executed an agreement with the MPCA (Minnesota Pollution Control Agency) to "reduce and minimize" wastewater releases from the sanitary sewer system. This means that the City must develop a comprehensive I&I (Inflow & Infiltration) program to determine how to reduce clean water from getting into City sanitary sewers and private property sanitary sewer services.

After conducting comprehensive smoke testing of sewer pipes during October 2018, it has become evident to staff to identify and pinpoint where clean water first enters the sewer system. After conducting research, staff recommends hiring Stantec to install flow monitoring equipment in sanitary sewers south of Eleventh Avenue NW/NE at key locations in order to find clean water sources which lead to wastewater releases from our "hot spot" wastewater release locations.

BUDGET IMPACT: The attached proposal from Stantec ranges from \$149,100 to \$198,500 depending on the length of the flow monitoring program, up to five (5) months. This expenditure would come from the 2019 Sanitary Sewer Fund Capital Improvement Program.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED: With a consultant, City staff has conducted an electric pulse pipe demonstration project. This demonstration did not convince City staff that it would be a cost effective, reliable method to recommend I&I corrective action. Staff has also considered not conducting any monitoring program while simply continuing with repairing pipes. However, based on the Schedule of Compliance goals, a proactive identification approach to pinpoint "hot spot" leaks has the most merit.

RECOMMENDATION: City Council authorization for the City Manager to enter into the attached agreement with Stantec to conduct I&I flow monitoring as part of the I&I Reduction Plan.

REVIEW

On November 19, 2018, the City of Waseca received a completed application for a subdivision and replat for the properties located on the SE corner of North State Street and 15th Ave NE in Waseca, MN. Preliminary and Final Plats depicting current and proposed conditions were received along with the application.

Emily Kronebusch, on behalf of Kwik Trip, Inc., is requesting a subdivision and replat for three (3) complete parcels and one (1) partial parcel.

There was one public comment received as of 12.6.2018, in favor of the project, yet concerned about pedestrian and traffic safety on Highway 13.

FINDINGS

In the case of all subdivisions, the findings necessary for City Council approval of the preliminary plat and the final plat shall be as follows:

- (A) The proposed subdivision, including the design, shall be consistent with all applicable general and specialized city, county and regional plans, including, but not limited to the city's comprehensive plan, level of service (LOS) standards which may be established in the comprehensive plan for streets and other public facilities and with Ch. 154 of this code.
- (B) The physical characteristics of this site, including, but not limited to topography, soils, vegetation, susceptibility to erosion and siltation, susceptibility to flooding, water storage, drainage and retention, are such that the site is suitable for the type of development and uses contemplated.
- (C) The proposed subdivision shall adequately provide for water supply, storm water drainage and control, wastewater transportation, erosion control and all other services, facilities and improvements otherwise required herein.
- (D) The design of the subdivision or the type of improvements shall not adversely impact public health, safety and welfare, nor shall the proposed subdivision have an adverse impact on the reasonable development of the neighboring land.
- (E) The design of the subdivision or the type of improvements will not conflict with easements of record or with easements established by judgment of a court.

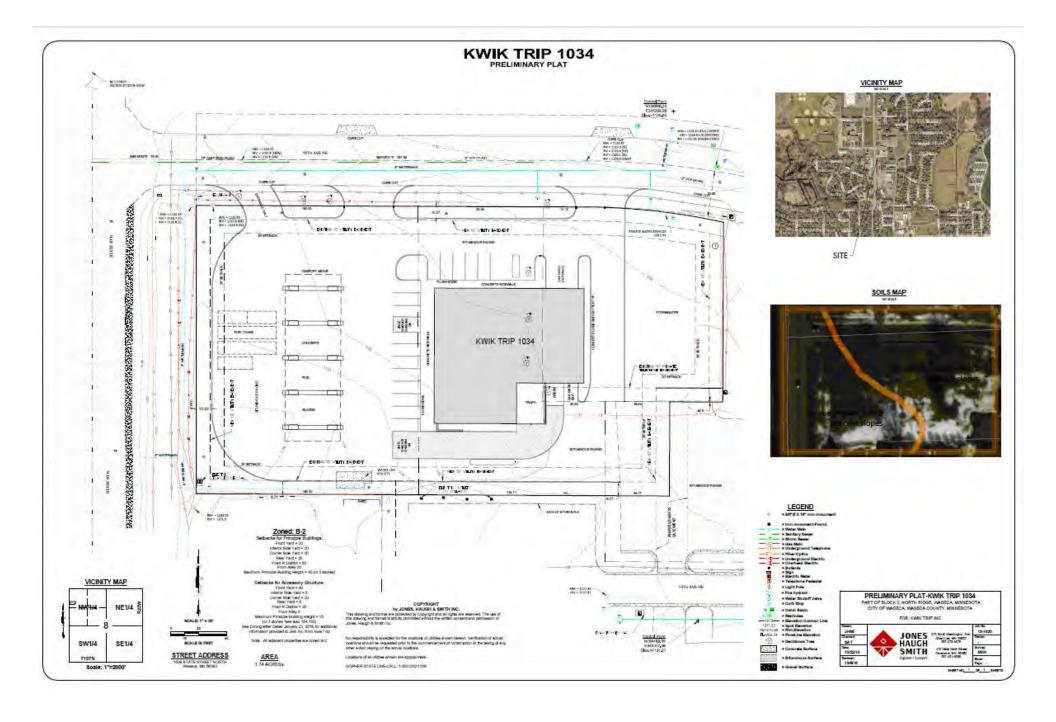
RECOMMENDATION

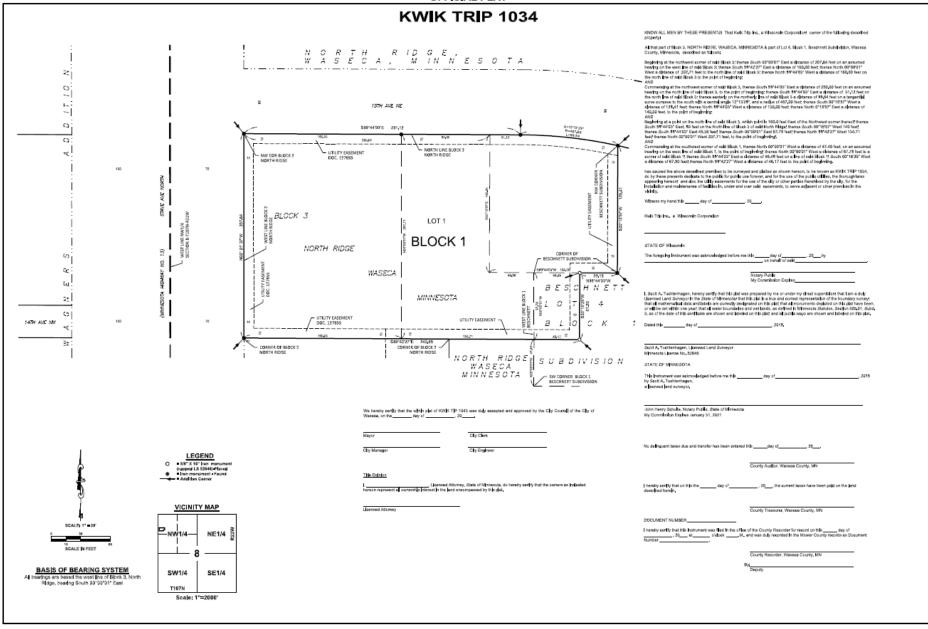
REQUESTED ACTION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waseca makes the following findings of fact related to the proposed development and requested Preliminary Plat and Final Plat:
