# 8B Commission Reports

<u>Fire Relief Association – May 30 meeting - Council Member Conrath gave a report on Fire Relief Association</u>. He said they are working on increasing fundraising, finishing up their bylaws, and that the fair booth will not get new fryers this year, working on 2019.

<u>Heritage Preservation Commission</u>—June 4 Meeting — Councilmember Tlougan gave an update from the Heritage Preservation Commission Meeting held on June 4. He stated the City is expecting the Downtown Nomination in the next couple of weeks. Also, Ginny Way from the State Historic Preservation Office came to Waseca and gave a presentation to downtown business/building owners on May 30.

<u>Park Board – June 5 Meeting</u> – Council Member Christiansen talked about the Park Board. The board discussed painting lines on the basketball courts, library musical park located outside the library, park entrance signs, and briefly discussed the Northwest Nature Area and the dog park. He said Rotary raised \$2,300 for trees along Elm Ave. Finally, he talked about the rentals at Clear Lake Park and the hours for rentals being 12-6 on weekends

<u>Airport Board– June 5 Meeting</u> – Councilmember Rose informed the Council that the meeting was held today, an intern from MNSU was in attendance. He stated that the culvert under the runway needs to be replaced and is owned by the City. The Airport will fund the project. The work will begin in early September and the airport will be shut down for two weeks. The new

FBO Hanger was discussed, the grant is in place and the ground breaking will take place in July. The project will run about 20 weeks until completion (end of November). Finally, the new landing area for the skydivers has been seeded

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- -Council Member Fitch said the Water Park is now open! You can win a free family pass on Discover Waseca Tourism Website. Almost all hotel rooms are booked for the Sesquicentennial weekend. Sesquicentennial Shirts will be available for purchase during the fair.
