2022 Parks Department Summary

The Waseca Park Department is responsible for the maintenance and improvement of approximately 200 acres of park land. The Park Department currently maintains 15 beautiful parks comprised of 80+ acres, which includes a full array of recreational amenities and facilities. Maplewood Park and Northwest Nature Park provide over 120 nature acres to those seeking the solitude nature offers plus offering a unique environmental educational learning experience. The Park Department also maintains approximately 9.75 miles of hard surface trails throughout Waseca.

The Park Department is also responsible for maintaining approximately 30 City owned areas, the grounds of City Hall and snow removal of City sidewalks, bike trails and park parking lots. The Waseca Park staff is committed to provide for park user enjoyment a safe, clean, fun, and aesthetically pleasing park system.

The Park Advisory Board (5 members) holds monthly meetings to consider City park matters that may be referred by the City Council, City Manager, or as the members of the Park Board deem proper. The board will make recommendations to the City Manager and City Council pertaining to park land developments, improvements, and use.











2022 Parks Department Shelter Reservations
